







# WRENSHALL PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT ENROLLMENT PROCESS

### TARGET CLASS SIZES TO ENSURE QUALITY INSTRUCTION

In 2024, the Wrenshall Board of Education and teachers collaborated to establish target class sizes to ensure quality instruction. Those established targets are:

- Preschool-Kindergarten = 20
- Grades 1-3 = 23
- Grades 4-6 = 25
- Grades 7-8 = 28
- High School = 30 for most classes

### OPENING AND CLOSING GRADES, ADDING SECTIONS

Since the above targets were established, class sizes have been proactively monitored. This can result in closing grades to open enrollment from outside of the district boundaries in accordance with Minnesota Statute 124D.03. It can also result in the addition of sections to grade levels.

### PROCESS FOR ACCEPTING OPEN ENROLLMENT APPLICATIONS

Per statute, a wait list for each closed grade shall be established to provide for a nondiscriminatory and orderly process for accepting open enrollment applications without creating undue hardship upon the District's resources and its capacity to provide a Free and Appropriate Public Education to all students served. The following preference criteria will be applied to open enrollment wait list applicants for the 2025-2026 school year:

- 1. Applicants whose parent or legal guardian is a current employee of Independent District No. 100.
- 2. Applicants for which a sibling or member of the same household has been accepted for open enrollment in a grade level which has not been closed by resolution.
- 3. Applicants not meeting the above criteria will be offered open enrollment opportunities when available based on the earliest date on which their completed General Statewide Enrollment Options Application for K-12 and Early Childhood Special Education was received by the District.

Applicants offered open enrollment must complete enrollment within ten (10) days of the District's notification and transportation may be offered, although not required beyond the District's boundaries as described in statute.

- 1. The bidding process will begin with an email inquiry to Rosy Bradley in the district office (rbradley@isd100.org).
- 2. Removal of the historic scoreboard from the school premises must be arranged through the Wrenshall School Facilities Manager and will need to take place no later than July 31, 2025.

If there is no interest, the sign will be offered to an electronics recycler in accordance with school policies 802 and 805.

### City Minutes

WRENSHALL CITY COUNCIL April 2, 2025, 6:00 p.m. Regular Meeting

Attendance: Joyce Gvesrude, Duane Ziebarth, Jeff Bloom, Kevin House, and Steve Studniski.were present. Alieca Johnson, Mandie Resberg, Mike Gravelle, Peter Laveau and one resident were also in attendance.

Jordan White from Clasen & Schiessl attended the meeting via Zoom to give an overview of the city's audit. Motion by Gvesrude; seconded by Studniski to accept the 2024 Audit as presented. Motion carried.

Motion by; Ziebarth; seconded by Gvesrude to approve the Agenda as presented. Motion carried.

Motion by Studniski; seconded by House to approve the Consent Agenda including minutes from the Regular Council Meeting on March 5, 2025, Pre-paid Checks/Electronic Transfers - \$19,505.20; and April Meeting Bills/Electronic Transfers -\$22,971.26. Check #s 31431-31468 (31461-Void) and 18e-22e. Motion carried.

Fire Chief: Two new firefighters have completed probation. Motion by Gvesrude; seconded by House to approve A. Knight and D. Rossing as members of the Wrenshall Fire Department. Motion carried. Motion by Studniski; seconded by Gvesrude to start the probationary period for N. Kuppinger. Motion carried. Extrication tools ordered have arrived, and one damaged in transit has been repaired. Mike's Repair Service has completed repair/maintenance on fire vehicles (parts/labor = \$4,090.38). The Wrenshall School is working out the details of the severe weather emergency evacuation plan and will be meeting with city officials.

Thank you to Representative Jeff Dotseth, Commissioner Zmyslony, Mark Thell and Bollig Engineering for their help with the bonding request at the State Capitol.

Engineering: Jeff Bloom's testimony before the State Finance Committee went very well. Bollig will monitor the status of the bonding bill and whether or not the city's project makes it on the list. A Congressionally Directed Spending Request (CDSR) for federal funds has been submitted through Senator Klobuchar's office. Mike Bubany from David Drown & Associates will be asked to update the council on how to plan for capital improvements.

Water Operator: A problem with wiring at the Parkwood lift station was corrected, and a new battery needed for controls at the water building was purchased and installed.

Clerk: The clerk has met with Dwyer Johnson from Northern Natural Gas as part of their annual safety reporting and attended MCFOA training in Brooklyn Center March 18-21. WLSSD has approved the 2024/2025 I & I Report/Workplan as submitted. A video of the testimony at the State Capitol is available on the website.

Maintenance: Mike's Repair has completed maintenance on the plow truck. Oil and filters on the tractor will need to be changed soon. Brush cutting along Pioneer continues. Other projects include cleaning the maintenance garage and city-wide manhole inspections.

Pru Ponds: Motion by Studniski; seconded by Ziebarth to request wetlands specialist Michael Krick to give an opinion on the ponds and wetland areas of Outlot A. Motion carried. Bollig may also be contacted if additional information is needed.

Motion by Studniski; seconded by Bloom to approve using the owl device to record city council meetings starting in May. Videos
