WRENSHALL PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT ENROLLMENT PROCESS

TARGET CLASS SIZES TO ENSURE QUALITY INSTRUCTION

In 2024, the Wrenshall Board of Education and teachers collaborated to establish target class sizes to ensure quality instruction. Those established targets are:

- Preschool-Kindergarten = 20
- Grades 1-3 = 23
- Grades 4-6 = 25
- Grades 7-8 = 28
- High School = 30 for most classes

OPENING AND CLOSING GRADES, ADDING SECTIONS

Since the above targets were established, class sizes have been proactively monitored. This can result in closing grades to open enrollment from outside of the district boundaries in accordance with Minnesota Statute 124D.03. It can also result in the addition of sections to grade levels.

PROCESS FOR ACCEPTING OPEN ENROLLMENT APPLICATIONS

Per statute, a wait list for each closed grade shall be established to provide for a nondiscriminatory and orderly process for accepting open enrollment applications without creating undue hardship upon the District's resources and its capacity to provide a Free and Appropriate Public Education to all students served. The following preference criteria will be applied to open enrollment wait list applicants for the 2025-2026 school year:

- 1. Applicants whose parent or legal guardian is a current employee of Independent District No. 100.
- 2. Applicants for which a sibling or member of the same household has been accepted for open enrollment in a grade level which has not been closed by resolution.
- 3. Applicants not meeting the above criteria will be offered open enrollment opportunities when available based on the earliest date on which their completed General Statewide Enrollment Options Application for K-12 and Early Childhood Special Education was received by the District.

Applicants offered open enrollment must complete enrollment within ten (10) days of the District's notification and transportation may be offered, although not required beyond the District's boundaries as described in statute.

WRENSHALL COMMUNITY ROOTS

During the 2021 school year, Wrenshall Public School District utilized special state funds under the Governor's Discretionary American Rescue Plan. These funds were made available for support of academic enrichment, mental health for students, communities, and schools.

Wrenshall's PIE (Partners in Education) collaborated with the school, Alyssa Bloss from the Carlton County SWCD (Soil & Water Conservation District), and Northern Ecological Landscapes based out of Esko, to create large, native plantings on the south and west sides of the school grounds.

The project included a vast pollinator garden in front of the school, with a variety of native Minnesota flowers and grasses to create a habitat for native pollinators such as butterflies, bees, and birds. In addition, the west area of the school was planted with native shrubs and trees to create shade on the playground side of the school.

A portion of the funds was also allocated to build and place garden boxes on the west side of the school. The boxes were built in Mr. Gustafson's class and set up by kindergarten teacher Mrs. George. The entire project was completed in September of 2023, revitalizing and beautifying our school grounds.

We now need to establish a structured volunteer program to maintain and ensure the ongoing success of our school gardens!

This will include watering, weeding, pest protection, and general maintenance of the grounds. Depending on participation, we could also assist our maintenance staff by contributing

to other outdoor chores like trimming the grass edges around the school.

A NOTE FROM THE NURSE'S OFFICE: YOUR CHILD SHOULD STAY HOME IF:

They have had a temperature of 100 degrees or higher in the past 24 hours. The student may return to school when they are fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication.

They have an uncontrolled cough.

They have an undiagnosed rash.

^a They have vomited (related to illness) within the past ¹ 24 hours.

They have uncontrolled diarrhea and need to use the bathroom frequently.

They have strep throat. Stay home until 12 hours after antibiotic treatment begins (and fever free for 24 hrs if one is present).

They feel too ill to remain in class and benefit from attending school.

This is an exciting opportunity to create outdoor experiences for students including pollinator awareness curriculum, outdoor

environmental resources and activities, and presentations on the importance of creating and supporting native habitats in our local area.

Next steps are to create a groundskeeping committee. Misty Bergman from our PIE group came up with the name *Community Roots* and we all agreed it embodies our vision for this evolving project!

In addition, Kevin Kot, our Native American Cultural Liaison, is excited to share his resources and partner with us to expand our learning opportunities and to incorporate the

idea of food sovereignty. Food sovereignty includes ensuring access to healthy, appropriate food, produced in a sustainable manner, and controlled by the people who produce and consume it.

Some of his goals are to plant a medicine garden, build a seed keeping program, and utilize outdoor learning spaces. Mr. Kot also plans to create a food garden to be tended



by students and used as part of our school food program. Some of these classes may be accredited in the future.

Exciting News!

Wrenshall's bus fleet is now over 50% propane.

- Our new propane school bus was purchased with the help of a \$25,000 EPA grant.
- An anticipated \$4,000 rebate from the Minnesota Propane Association will be an additional financial boost.
- \cdot The sunsetting payment of our last bus purchase will coincide with the first payment of this newest bus.
- Wrenshall now runs five propane buses.

The benefits of propane buses:

- Health and creature comforts: No diesel exhaust and no cold-start issues
- Fiscal and environmental: Propane fuel and oil is less expensive than diesel and burns cleaner. Propane buses have fewer maintenance issues and typically have lower maintenance costs.
- Environmental: Propane buses lower harmful emissions and exceed current EPA standards by 90% as compared to diesel.

City Minutes

WRENSHALL CITY COUNCIL March 5, 2025, 6:00 p.m. Regular Meeting

Attendance: Jeff Bloom, Kevin House, Steve Studniski. Councilor Ziebarth and Councilor Gvesrude were absent. Alieca Johnson, Mandie Resberg, Nathan Fiest and one resident were also in attendance.

Motion by; Studniski; seconded by House to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried.

Motion by House; seconded by Studniski to approve the Consent Agenda including minutes from the Regular Council Meeting on February 5, 2025, Prepaid Checks/Electronic Transfers of \$35,148.71; and March Meeting Bills/Electronic Transfers of \$38,442.70. Check #s: 31361-31431 (31391-31396-Void) and Ile-17e. Motion carried.

Fire Chief: The fire chief was not in attendance. Jeff Bloom was invited to attend the Wrenshall School Safety Committee Meeting on March 19, 2025, to discuss weather evacuation planning.

Engineering: The PER is complete, and it has been submitted to the USDA. Bollig will continue to work on the city's behalf to secure grant funding. It was recommended that the city also complete a Congressional Directed Spending Request (CDSR) in the amount of \$2M. Representative Pete Stauber has been successful in the past in securing these federal funds.

Motion by Studniski; seconded by House directing Bollig to apply for the CDSR on the city's behalf. Motion carried.
